Hotel Cellai is a family owned and run hotel built in a beautifully restored 18th century building offering you the magic atmosphere and the charm of living in a Florentine Home. Rooms have a private bath with shower, air conditioning, direct dial phone, color TV, fridge-bar and hairdryer.

DAILY ITINERARY

Day 1: Departure from Boston

Depart from Boston on your Alitalia flight to Rome.

Day 2: Flight from Rome to Florence

Arrive in Rome board your connecting flight to Florence. Upon arrival in Florence, retrieve your luggage and clear customs. You will be met by our local representative who will assist you during the transfer to the Hotel Cellai in downtown Florence. Check in and receive room assignments. The rest of the day is at leisure to get acquainted with the hotel and surroundings.

Day 3: Florence – walking tour

Buffet breakfast at the hotel and soon after depart on a guided walking tour of Florence. You'll visit the Piazza del Duomo: the Cathedral with Brunelleschi's Dome, the Belltower by Giotto and the Baptistry with the Gate of Paradise, by Lorenzo Ghiberti. Although they were erected in different periods they look similar because they were built with white and green marble. Continue along the elegant Via dei Calzaioli lined with many exclusive boutiques that lure to their window and we land in Piazza della Signoria. The square is dominated by the austere beauty of the Palazzo Vecchio which represents the might of the Florentine Republic. In front of the Palazzo

Vecchio stands a copy of statue of David in the place where the original masterpiece by Michelangelo once stood. Remainder of the day is at leisure. **(B)**

Days 4-5-6: Florence

Buffet breakfast daily at the hotel. You have three days for you to explore this extraordinary vibrant city at your own pace. Falling in love with Florence at first sight is easy and you leave it carrying with your for ever the memory of its radiant beauty. This city, the cradle of the Renaissance, is like an open book, written in the figurative language of humanism, a text which it has handed on to the entire world a sense of sound of rational proportion, the very essence of the Florentine genius. Because the center Florence is relatively small it is best discovered on foot. Very close to the Hotel Cellai is the Museo dell'Accademia where you can admire the original "David" by Michelangelo" as well as other sculptures by Michelangelo. Continue on the Via Cavour and arrive at the Church of San Lorenzo. From here the Museo dell'Opera del Duomo is not too far. By far the most interesting museum, the Uffizi Gallery, is located just around the corner from Piazza Signoria, and should not be missed. Florence also offers great shopping opportunities -- look for traditional Florentine leather and also fine jewelry. The exquisite work of skilled goldsmiths with dates back to Benvenuto Cellini, a great artist of the renaissance. You can find his bust on the Ponte Vecchio where many jewelry shops are found. If you are looking for designer boutiques you can indulge in Via Tornabuoni and Via Calzaiouli. If you are looking for bargains you can shop the colorful open-air market of San Lorenzo and practice the art of bargaining. **(B)**

Day 7: Return to Boston

Morning transfer to Florence airport for your return flight to Boston, via Rome. **(B)**
