PLIMOTH PLANTATION

This living museum represents the original settlement of the Plymouth Colony established in the 17th century by European colonists, some of whom later became known as Pilgrims. The settlement has been recreated to appear as it would have in 1627—from houses and street plots to the tools, furnishings and items of everyday Colonial life. In the 1627 English Village section of the museum, interpreters have been trained to speak, act and dress appropriately for the period.

Plimoth Plantation's Thanksgiving dining programs are immensely popular: fresh ingredients, festive surroundings and a sense of history that can be found nowhere else in the world. An unforgettable holiday experience!

WAMPANOAG HOMESITE
