DAILY ITINERARY

September 12: Overnight Flight to Rome

Evening departure from Boston to Rome, via Alitalia Airlines. Dinner will be served on board. Relax and enjoy the in-flight entertainment.

September 13: Arrive Rome, connecting flight to Barcelona

Continental breakfast will be served before landing in Rome. Clear immigration and proceed to your connecting flight to Barcelona. Once in Barcelona, retrieve your luggage, clear customs and meet our local representative who will assist you with the transfer to the port of Barcelona where you will embark on the Costa Marina sailing at 4pm.

September 14: Monaco -- 10am-7pm

Tucked inside the Maritime Alps between the French and Italian Riviera on the Mediterranean Sea, Monaco is a sovereign independent state that has long been associated with glamour and exclusivity. Monaco is most famed for its glamorous Monte Carlo casino, Formula One cars roaring through the streets during its glamorous Grand Prix, and the scintillating lives of its glamorous royal family, the Grimaldis. *(B,L,D)*

OPTIONAL EXCURSIONS IN MONTECARLO

MONACO, THE OCEANOGRAPHIC MUSEUM AND MONTE CARLO

You will leave the port by coach for a sightseeing tour of the Principality of Monaco. It is one of the smallest independent states in the world and its origins and history are inextricably bound up with the Grimaldi family, the ruling dynasty for over 700 years. Prince Rainier III in particular (who ruled from 1949 to 2005) gave a great boost to the growth of the Principality. His fairytale wedding to American actress Grace Kelly and the many projects and charities that he supported allowed this tiny state to become one of the most popular haunts of the international jet set. You will arrive in Monte Carlo, the best-known quarter of the Principality, with its casino, luxury hotels, high society and the streets in which the famous Formula One Grand Prix is held each year. You will then visit Monaco-Ville, the old town, situated on a fortified rock in a stunning position high above the sea. Here you will have the chance to visit the Oceanographic Museum with its world-famous aquarium. Next you will walk to the square that is home to the Prince's Palace and the little cathedral, which houses the remains of Prince Rainier and the much-loved Princess Grace, who died in a road accident still shrouded in mystery 30 years later.

GRASSE AND SAINT-PAUL DE VENCE

A coach will take you and your guide to Grasse, the world capital of the perfume industry. Here you will have the chance to visit a perfume factory and buy many products at special prices. You will then return to the coach for a scenic journey through the hills of inland Provence to the famous medieval town of Saint-Paul de Vence, entirely enclosed within 16th-century walls, which is now home to countless craft workshops and artists' studios. After a short tour of the picturesque little town, you will have some free time for lunch and shopping before returning to Monaco in the afternoon.

WALKING TOUR OF THE OLD TOWN OF MONACO

Your guide will greet you upon arrival and take you to discover Monaco-Ville, the oldest residential quarter of the Principality, which is situated on a fortified rock in a stunning position high above the sea. A pleasant stroll will take in the most important sights of the little town, allowing you to admire the façade of the grand Oceanographic Museum and cross the Saint-Martin gardens that overlook the sea. You will visit the little cathedral, which was the scene of the wedding of Prince Rainier and the American actress Grace Kelly, before ending your tour in the main square, dominated by the majestic Prince's Palace.

NICE AND CANNES, THE TWIN GEMS OF THE COTE D'AZUR

You will travel by coach to the celebrated city of Cannes, one of the most exclusive spots of the Côte d'Azur, where you will drive along the famous Croisette, the elegant waterfront avenue lined with luxury hotels, exclusive restaurants and haute-couture boutiques. You will stop at the Palais des Festivals, home of the annual Film Festival, which attracts the world's leading actors, whose handprints can be seen in the cement nearby. The coach will then take you to Nice, the capital of the Riviera. You will be enchanted by the Promenade des Anglais, the palm-lined promenade that runs along the spectacular "Bay of Angels", where you will be able to admire the majestic façade of the famous Art Nouveau-style Hotel Negresco. Your guide will then accompany you on a pleasant stroll through the old city, ending at the picturesque flower market.

September 15: Livorno, Italy -- 8:30am-7pm

Livorno is the capital of the smallest provinces of Italy, among the country's largest ports, Tuscany's third biggest town and the region's gateway to the Mediterranean Sea. Livorno has a canal that connects it to Pisa. The capital town situated on marshy land is called the Little Venice because of the many picturesque canals that wind their way through the town. *(B,L D)*



OPTIONAL EXCURSIONS IN LIVORNO

PISA, IN AND AROUND PIAZZA DEI MIRACOLI

An enchantingly beautiful city, Pisa was one of the old Maritime Republics and still preserves evidence of its Romanesque architecture, harmoniously fused with Gothic, Renaissance and Baroque buildings. You will meet your guide in the city who will accompany you on an historical itinerary centred around the famous Cathedral square ("Piazza del Duomo"), also known as "Piazza dei Miracoli" - the Square of Miracles. The Cathedral of Pisa certainly represents the maximum expression of the Pisan Romanesque style where elements of the classic tradition, from early Christian experiences, merge marvellously with Lombard and Byzantine motives under artistic influences from the Arab and Norman worlds with which the city was in contact. In this famous square you will have the chance to admire the Leaning Tower of Pisa, one of the 7 wonders of the world, where souvenir photographs are an absolute must. You will be enchanted by your visit to the Baptistery, which houses some true art treasures. At the end of your guided tour, and before leaving the city you will have some free time to spend in this gem of a square.

THE TREASURES OF FLORENCE

You will leave by coach from the port of Livorno for Florence, the European city of culture. At Florence you will meet your local guide who will take you on a panoramic tour of the city by bus up to Piazza Michelangelo, where there is a monument dedicated to Michelangelo with a bronze reproduction of David. From here you will discover the superb view of Florence from on high yet within reach, surrounded by its green countryside and yet charming urban dimensions. You will return towards the heart of the old city and from here you will continue on foot following an itinerary rich with history. Walking through the streets of the centre you will discover the Cathedral of Santa Maria del Fiore (the "Duomo") in all its beauty, together with its famous Bell tower (Campanile) by Giotto. Nearby you will have the chance to admire Saint John's Baptistery, a typical construction of the Romanesque Florentine style faced with white and green marble. You will then continue your walk to Piazza della Signoria, a historic meeting place for the citizens of Florence. This is one of the most beautiful locations in Tuscany, containing monuments from every era, and dominated by the powerful mass of the Palazzo Vecchio, the Palazzo Fenzi and the Loggia dei Lanzi. A souvenir photograph with the Ponte Vecchio as a backdrop will be an unforgettable reminder of your trip. After lunch you will continue on foot to Piazza Santa Croce, to admire the Church of the same name. Here lies the tomb of the poet Ugo Foscolo, who once sang the Sepulchres, which spoke of the glories of ancient Italy - "l'Itale glorie" - buried in the tombs of Santa Croce. You will have some free time here to take some photographs of the art treasures of inestimable value or to do some exclusive "Made in Italy" shopping.

LUCCA, THE FORTRESS CITY

The historical heart of Lucca is protected and surrounded by strong city walls, which date back to the Renaissance period. Here you will meet your local guide who will accompany you on your discovery of the marvellous old part of the town through streets and monuments rich with history. You will admire the Piazza Amfiteatro; the central square so called as it is built on the site of a Roman Amphitheatre from the II Century AD, some of the arches of which are still visible. You will stroll through the streets of the centre of Lucca to the beautiful Church of San Michele in Foro (outside visit), which was begun in 1143 and finished in the fourteenth century and represents one of the purest examples of Roman architecture in Pisan-Lucca style. Your guide will then take you to the San Martino Cathedral, which was commenced in the XII century in Roman style and today stands in Gothic style due to the restoration carried out in the XIV-IV centuries. At the end of your artistic itinerary, you will have some free time to take a relaxing walk in the streets of the centre or to do a bit of shopping.

CARRARA, CITY OF MARBLE

A panoramic motorway journey of approximately one hour will take you past many charming villages on the Tuscan Riviera and inland before reaching Carrara, a small town situated in the heart of the Marble Mountains. You will have the opportunity to admire a landscape which appears almost "unreal", surrounded by mountains which have been literally carved in marble. You will meet your guide in Fantascritti who will accompany you on a visit to discover the process for the extraction and treatment of marble. You will have the chance to admire a small but significant museum where historical mementoes and real evidence show just how hard the life and work of marble excavators once was.

September 16: Olbia, Sardinia -- 8:00am-5:00pm

The city of Olbia overlooks a splendid gulf crowned by the Island of Tavolata, surrounded by beautiful beaches and clear emerald green sea and perfumed with the scent of myrtle and strawberry tree. Strolling through the central streets, you will always find somebody who will tell you the city's history, which will take you on a journey through a wonderful fairy tale making you feel that you never want to leave. *(B,L,D)*

OPTIONAL EXCURSIONS IN OLBIA, SARDINIA

THE EMERALD COAST, FROM TOURISM TO TRADITION

Your trip will take you to a habitat which remains both charming and mysterious. Everything in Sardinia has an air of mystery, from the nuraghe (rock formations) to the fertile and sunny countryside, which to this day is the main source of profit for the region, through sheep farming. Your trip will start with a panoramic tour of the Emerald Coast, approximately 40 Km of beaches and seaside along the North West coast. The name of this area is linked to the particular colour of the sea, in transparent greens and turquoises. The amazing countryside, which you will visit, is dominated by granite rocks in fantastic formations. Here, harmoniously tucked away between the granite and the Mediterranean Sea lie the new residential complexes of Cala di Volpe, Capriccioli and Romazzino. Your local guide will help you discover some of the pearls of the Emerald Coast: Baia Sardinia, the town of San Pantaleo and the exclusive location of Porto Cervo, a famous holiday resort. Here you will be able to browse and "devour" the elegant shopping zone or admire the many local handcrafted objects, in wood and ceramics, from the imaginative straw basketwork to the cork and wrought iron objects. Sardinia is waiting to be discovered and experienced: explore it with us and enjoy yourself as you meander through this unexplored labyrinth.

THE VALLEY OF THE MOON

After boarding a motorcoach, you'll travel to Calangianus, renowned for the production, processing and export of cork. At Tempio Pausania, situated on a granite upland covered with cork trees and vineyards, you can see the peak of majestic Mount Limbara. A short visit to the temple gives you the opportunity to admire the austere elegance of its architecture. You'll continue by coach to Aggius, where you will have the opportunity to take photographs immortalizing the rocky landscape which is molded by the fierce winds. Higher up, you'll stop at the Valley of the Moon, a striking upland that recalls images of a lunar landscape, composed of erratic boulders of granite eroded by the wind. Here you can make out the shapes of animals and people in the boulders. These bizarre figures can be interpreted in all sorts of ways, so you let your imagination run wild.

TRAIN TOUR TO THE HEART OF THE GALLURA REGION

Discover the heart of the Gallura region in a most unusual way - by train. Your train will take you to the center of this wild and primitive area, whose distance from the sea has ensured that the lifestyle of its inhabitants and natural environment have remained undisturbed over the centuries. Then board a motorcoach from Olbia to the village of Arzachena, where you will board the train specially booked for your tour. You will get off the train at the Temple of Pausania Station - an Art Nouveau gem set in an enchanting town, where you can stroll around the narrow streets of the center. If you feel your energy flagging, you can refuel on specialities such as "Carasau" bread, tangy cheese and local wine. Then its back to Olbia by coach.

September 17: Capri, Italy -- 8:00am-1:00pm

Capri is considered by many to be one of the most beautiful islands in the world...yet at one time it wasn't an island at all. Archaeological excavations made in 1905 during the construction of a hotel discovered animal bones and primitive weapons, evidence that the island was part of the Sorrentine peninsula, to which it is still connected via an underground 5km-long stretch of rock previously above sea-level. Excavations also revealed other fascinating remains in the south of Capri, adding to the island's charm not only as a tourist destination but also as a place of cultural and historical interest. Geologically, Capri is divided in two. In the upper part, Anacapri, the inhabitants previously survived on agriculture, while in the lower part, Marina Grande, fishing and commerce were the main activities. *(B,L,D)*

ANACAPRI AND CAPRI

The island of Capri boasts an extremely beautiful natural landscape, dotted with vineyards and gardens. Starting in Anacapri, you will visit Villa San Michele, home of Axel Munthe, the famous Swedish doctor and writer. The villa is home to precious 17th century furniture and archaeological finds. Then it's on to Capri, the island's capital, home to the famous Piazza Umberto I which is completely surrounded by little white houses, making it appear to be an inner courtyard.

CAPRI AND THE BLUE GROTTA

The famous grotto was well-known to the ancient inhabitants, as will be evident from the remains of the Roman structures. The blue color, which completely bathes the walls of the Grotto is caused from the sunlight entering through a large opening beneath sea level. The inside of the Grotto, which can be reached by special rowing boats, measures 54x15x30 meters. The excursion involves disembarking from the ship into large boats for the journey to the Grotto entrance, where it will be necessary to change over to smaller rowing boats. After the visit to the Grotto, you'll be taken by bus to Capri, the island's principle town and the heart of tourist activity and everyday life. There will be a stop for a rest in the famous Piazza Umberto I, in the heart of the town, completely enclosed, like a courtyard, by small white houses.

A VIEW OF CAPRI FROM THE FUNICULAR

Over the centuries, the beauty and charm of this island have enchanted Roman emperors Augustus and Tiberius and many artists, writers and intellectuals who discovered it in the 19th century. After your arrival at the port of Marina Grande, the funicular will take you to the centre of the island in a matter of minutes. With your guide you will reach the famous "piazzetta," the heart of the island's social life and a true open air salon enclosed by characteristic buildings and cafés that are lively at any hour of the day. You will walk through the via Tragara, with its luxurious hotels and historical villas to reach the gardens of Augustus, with an enchanting view over the Marina Piccola bay and the Faraglioni, the symbol of the island the word over. Once your visit is over, you will have time to take amazing photographs, do some shopping in the alleys around the centre or enjoy a wonderful ice cream, while sitting comfortably at one of the cafés in the small square.

September 18: Tunis, Tunisia -- 8:00am-2:00pm

Tunis, with 700,000 inhabitants, is the capital of the Tunisian Republic and the political and economic center of the country. The city centre is curiously situated in the internal part of the coast, approximately 10 kilometres from the sea at the east end side of a lagoon one- to two-metre deep. **Tunis** is strong and is a city with two personalities, Arab and European. Islam culture is evident at every corner but the percentage of Catholics in the internal part of the country is relevant. This double characteristic is evident everywhere in the city with contrasting elements that have evolved into a unique style. The most important religious center is the Olive Mosque, the largest and most venerated Islamic sanctuary in Tunis. *(B,L,D)*

OPTIONAL EXCURSIONS IN TUNIS

CARTHAGE AND THE TREASURES OF THE BARDO MUSEUM

You will be met at the port by an expert local guide, who will take you back through the centuries to discover the exceptionally rich historical and cultural heritage of the Tunisian capital. Your first stop will be the archaeological site of Carthage. For centuries the city was the most important Mediterranean port, until its destruction in 146 BC by the Romans, who considered it a dangerous rival. The city was subsequently rebuilt as a Roman colony, but definitively abandoned following the Barbarian invasions. Archaeological excavations have uncovered important finds from Punic times (the Punic Ports and the Tophet) and the Roman period (the Baths, the Theatre and the Amphitheatre). You will then return to Tunis for a visit to the Bardo Museum. The Bardo is the oldest museum in the whole of Africa and houses important historical artefacts and artistic treasures. Don't miss the world's largest and most precious collection of Roman mosaics, which have been perfectly preserved, and the statues of deities and mythological figures.

TUNIS' MEDINA, SOUKS AND CARTHAGE

This tour will allow you to discover two of the many aspects of fascinating Tunisia: its historical treasures and the legacy of the Arab culture. Your first stop will be the archaeological site of Carthage. For centuries the city was the most important Mediterranean port, until its destruction in 146 BC by the Romans, who considered it a dangerous rival. The city was subsequently rebuilt as a Roman colony, but definitively abandoned following the Barbarian invasions. Archaeological excavations have uncovered important finds from Punic times (the Punic Ports and the Tophet) and the Roman period (the Baths, the Theatre and the Amphitheatre). Upon arrival in Tunis, you will be able to soak up the characteristic atmosphere of the Medina, the old town considered by many the most beautiful and best preserved in North Africa and a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1979. After admiring the Great Mosque with its imposing minaret, you will enter the souk (the Arabic word for "market"). The characteristic narrow streets lined with shops of all kinds and the workshops of craftsmen are not solely for shopping, but also a meeting place for local people. Your guide will accompany you among the inebriating fragrances of the perfume souk, the bright colours of the wool souk and the chechias souk, selling the characteristic local caps. You will also stop at a typical shop where you can admire the famous traditional Tunisian carpets. It will be difficult to resist the temptation to take home a typical souvenir from this unique place.

THE BEACH OF GAMMARTH

Leaving the port by bus we will head towards Carthage and after passing through a beautiful residential area we will arrive in ammarth. During the the XIX century this was one of the favourite places where wealthy tunisian people used to spend their vacations. Nowadays thanks to its renowned hotels and its marvellous coast characterized by sandy bays and rocky headlands, it is considered a jewel of the tunisian tourism. Our final destination is one of the most luxury resort in Gammarth: here we will enjoy a welcome cocktail and then we will have free time to sunbath on the golden sandy beach, have a relaxing bath in the clear Tunisian sea or even have a swim in the beautiful swimming pool of the hotel, surrounded by palms.

PANORAMIC TOUR OF TUNIS AND SHOPPING

You will leave the port of Tunis, a fascinating city with a dual Arab and European personality, and cross the modern city, built during French rule and characterized by wide boulevards and imposing public and private buildings, to Government Square, the gateway to the fascinating Medina, or old town, where you will feel as though you have stepped back in time. Your guide will accompany you on a pleasant stroll to the Great Mosque, which you can admire from the outside, and its imposing minaret, and show you around the lively colourful souks (the Arabic word for "market"). Here you will be able to browse the various goods on display (including fabrics, jewellery and perfumes) and buy some characteristic souvenirs. You will stop at a typical shop where you can admire the famous traditional Tunisian carpets. Your tour will end with a trip to the picturesque village of Sidi Bou Said, renowned for its white houses with blue doors and shutters.

THE SOUK AND ALL ITS COLOURS

The fascination of north- Africa consists of their wide colourful merchandise, fragrances from the aromatic essences, the sparkle from the beaten silver, and if the madness does not scare you, by venders calling you, and if you have passion for the trade of art, and just to discover another country so diverse from ours, well this the excursion for you! Accompanied by the local guide, as we "lose" ourselves through the exciting paths in the Souk, a typical neighbourhood with a multitude of streets and back streets with characteristic handicrafts. We will negotiate more on the varied items, some being priceless or some just being useless but we will do our best to get a better price in order to take home the atmosphere of Tunisian folklore. We will stop in one of their typical Tunisian carpet stores and will be explained the culture of the Berber's and even today they still exist on their tradition and the local economy. The rest of our time will be exclusively dedicated to shopping, shopping and more shopping! A stop will be made in a typical Tunisian cafe' and will have the chance to re-admire all your gifts or even comparing them with your friends, offering that last "exotic" touch before leaving the land of the Berber"s. Please note: This tour is mainly all by foot inside the Souk"s; comfortable shoes are recommended , adequate clothing is required (we suggest legs and shoulders to be covered for ladies) Space is limited so please reserve early.

CARTHAGE AND SIDI BOU SAID

You will leave the port of La Goulette for the journey to Carthage accompanied by a local guide. Founded as a Phoenician trading post, Carthage rapidly grew to become one of the richest cities of the ancient world, until it was defeated and destroyed by the Romans in 146 BC. It rose from its ashes as a Roman colony in 44 BC and once again

became an important trading and cultural hub. However, following the Barbarian invasions it commenced a long decline, until falling to the Arabs, who used its ruins to build the nearby city of Tunis. Archaeological excavations have uncovered priceless artefacts, leading UNESCO to inscribe Carthage on its World Heritage List. Your first stop will be the Tophet, the sanctuary dedicated to the Punic deities Tanit and Baal Hammon, to whom firstborn children were sacrificed. Following a visit to the Baths of Antoninus, you will travel by coach to Byrsa Hill, where you will be able to visit the Cathedral of Saint Louis (outside visit only) and admire the magnificent view over Carthage and the Gulf of Tunis.
